BECOMING A DIFFERENCE MAKER FOR CHRIST: MEET PRASAD FROM SALVATION HOME IN NEPAL

Since the inception of our family homes program, we have celebrated the graduation of nine men and women who are now contributing members of society and are in the process of becoming "difference makers" within their respective communities. One of these graduates is Prasad*. Prasad was raised in our very first family home, Salvation Home. He spent 12 formative years there before moving out in January of 2018, and he recently graduated from a university where he earned his bachelor's degree in finance with an emphasis in accounting. Currently, Prasad is working part time as an accountant at an electricity office as well as at his local church and two of our family homes.



STAFF INTERCEPTS TWO FEMALES IN NAMIBIA EN ROUTE TO SOUTH AFRICA TO MEET INSTAGRAM FRIEND

Our team intercepted two young females at an airport who were traveling to South Africa to visit a friend they had recently met on Instagram who had arranged and paid for their airline tickets and hotel accommodations. With permission, our monitors were looking through their phones and reading conversations with their friend when they noticed a call coming through from him. They answered the phone and asked him several questions, and he claimed the females were visiting him for a photo shoot. His story contradicted the women's statements, confirming our staff's suspicions that they were at high risk of being trafficked. Our team intercepted the females to keep them safe and then helped them return to their homes.

TEAM INTERCEPTS VULNERABLE 16-YEAR-OLD FEMALE IN CAMBODIA AND HELPS HER RETURN HOME

Approaching a minor girl who was sitting alone, our team noticed that she seemed nervous and afraid. She explained that her family was poor and she needed to work to support them. Suddenly, an older woman began asking questions about the monitors who then recognized multiple discrepancies in the two females' stories. They later learned that the older woman was notorious for approaching young girls and offering to help them find work. The girl shared that this woman was arranging a job for her and had taken her to several different homes where people had taken pictures of her and given her new clothing and shoes. Based on multiple red flags, the young female was intercepted and safely returned to her family.
